

Moisés Hassán-Amsélem is a honorary lecturer on *Holocaust-Shoa Studies and Antisemitism* at the University "Pablo de Olavide" in Sevilla, Spain. Born in Sevilla, Moises is of Moroccan and Algerian heritage. When his father arrived in Sevilla to work in a brewery after graduating in Madrid as an Agricultural Engineer in 1963, he organized the few Jewish families that were already living there and re-established the "Israelite Community of Sevilla". He later became President of the Community until he passed away in 1995.

After being a foreign Exchange student in Modesto (California) during his senior year in High School, Moises returned back to Spain and attended University of Sevilla where he graduated in law in 1995; however, he began his professional career in the Telecom industry, working for 5 years as Sales Manager at the



multinational British Telecom PLC. He later changed his area of specialization and moved into the scrap metal business where he worked for another 4 years as an international trader. But later on, he completely changed his life and decided to focus on Jewish history of Spain. He is now fully dedicated to informal Jewish education in addition to his role at the University "Pablo de Olavide". He has lectured extensively during the last years in many places all around the globe, including Spain, the US and even Australia.
